ENTRY DEADLINE: All entries will be processed online through theshowportal.com by November 30th, 2026.

GATES OPEN: Gates open on for livestock, on Wednesday, December 9, 2026 at 4:00 p.m. and Thursday, December 10, 2026 starting at 8:00 a.m. All Expo animals must be in place no later than 11:00 a.m. on Friday, December 11. All animals will be assigned stalling or pen space. Please check with officials for your stall and pen assignments.

PUREBRED BREEDING GILT and CROSSBRED BREEDING GILT SHOW: Friday, December 11, 2026 following showmanship. **Top 3 in each breed will compete in the Supreme Gilt Drive Saturday at 5 p.m.**

Breed Champions Awarded to any Purebred breed with 8 entries or more and Crossbred Breeding Gilt

PUREBRED BARROW SHOW: Friday, December 11, 2026 following breeding gilt show. Breed Champions Awarded to any Purebred breed with 8 entries or more. **The Top 5 purebred barrows are eligible to compete for Overall Market Hog Champion Top 10 Awards which will be selected at 5 p.m. Saturday.**

Crossbred market hogs will show gilts and barrows together, but will be classified into a light cross and dark cross division. Dark cross market hogs do not have to classify. **All light cross market hogs must be classified in New South Arena during check in times. This will be done before you can pick up the weight card for that animal. Officials will be in the ring to classify and assist with this process.**

Light Cross: 1. A market hog must exhibit coloration consisting solely of white and/or blue. 2. A three-member classification committee will be responsible for determining eligibility under the light cross category. 3. Any market hog failing to meet the criteria for Light Cross shall be immediately reclassified to the Dark Cross division. 4. The decision rendered by the classification committee shall be final and not subject to appeal or protest.

Dark Cross: 1. Any market hog exhibiting the coloration other than white or blue shall be classified as dark cross. 2. This includes, but is not limited to, market hogs with black, red, or sandy coloring. 3. Market hogs in the Dark Cross category will not require committee classification.

HOG SHOW GUIDELINES

1. Any exhibitor 21 years of age or under is eligible to show.
2. All swine must be blood tested PRV and Brucellosis and have an official health certificate. All out-of-state swine must have a health certificate deemed appropriate by the Georgia Department of Agriculture. Please be timely in bleeding your hogs to facilitate the return of your health certificate prior to show date (GA diagnostic vet lab closes for some holidays).
3. Entries are *open to the world*. Market barrows, market gilts, purebred gilts, and purebred barrows are eligible. No boars! Market barrows and market gilts will be shown together by weight. Purebred gilts with registration certificates will be shown by breed as long there are 8 head within that breed, otherwise will show as AOB. Purebred gilts with registration papers will be shown by breed by age. Purebred barrows with registration certificates will be shown by weight.
4. The barn will open on Wednesday, December 9 beginning at 4:00 p.m. and on Thursday, December 10 beginning at 8:00 a.m.. Check in will be Thursday, December 10 from 2-5 p.m. and Saturday, December 12, 2026 from 8 a.m. – 11:00 a.m. All market hogs and purebred barrows must be weighed and turn in a weight card no later than 11 a.m. on Friday. Purebred barrows and purebred gilts must be checked in with an original registration certificate no later than 11 a.m.
5. There is no limit to the number of entries per exhibitor.
6. **Prize money will be paid to the first five places in each weight class. Contingent on the number of entries, proposed payouts will be 1st - \$40, 2nd - \$35, 3rd - \$30, 4th - \$25, 5th - \$20.**
7. **New this year: Every entry will be assigned one pen per pig. Your pen fee is built into your entry fee. No additional swine pens will be available for purchase.**
8. Entry window will be November 1st through November 30th. The entry fee is \$40.00 per pig. A late fee of \$20.00 per head cash will be required after this date and will be collected at check-in. The committee reserves the right to refund money to entries if the number of entries exceeds pen space. All entries should be submitted on theshowportal.com. **THE LATE FEE WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED AND NO REFUNDS WILL BE GIVEN.**
9. Pigs do not have to be entered in the State Market Hog Show to enter this show.
10. **Market Hog Show:** Divisions in the market hog show will be divided evenly among the classes, as far as possible. Crossbred Market hogs will classify as light cross and dark cross. Division winners will compete for Grand Champion honors. The number of divisions will be based on the entries of each classification. If you win your division in the light cross or dark cross division, that animal will be eligible to compete in the combined final drive on Saturday at 5 p.m. All market hog entries must have a clean, readable ear tag in place. Pigs must be tagged before check in.
11. **Purebred Shows:** All purebred gilts and barrows must be registered with a proper registration certificate from the National Swine Registry for their respective breed. Purebred entries must show the exhibitor's name or exhibitor's family farm as the current owner on the registration paper. Purebred animals do not have to have ear tags but must be ear notched according to their registration certificate. Entries must be farrowed on or after June 1, 2026. A minimum of 8 head will be required to hold a breed show, otherwise will be AOB.

12. Gilts CANNOT be doubled entered in the breeding Gilt Show and the Market Hog Show.

13. **Showmanship:** Showmanship will begin at 12:00 p.m. Friday, December 11, 2026. Exhibitors must pay a \$10.00 entry fee for the showmanship jackpot. Classes will be broken by the exhibitors' birthday. Showmanship will be shown from youngest to oldest and broken according to Georgia Junior Swine Boosters age divisions. Prize money for showmanship will be strictly a jackpot prize of money collected per showmanship division.
14. The rules committee reserves the right to interpret all rules. The decision of the judge and the rules committee will be final.
15. **Weighing and Weigh Back:** Exhibitors will be required to turn in weigh cards declaring the weight of each market entry. Official scales will be located in the barn and exhibitors will be responsible for weighing and turning in the weights of their particular entries. If an exhibitor wins a class or is 2nd place, they will be reweighed and must be within 15 lbs of the weight that is on the exhibitor's weight card. If an exhibitor weighs out, the 3rd place animal will be moved up and weighed. If necessary, this will continue until two exhibitors have weighed within 15 lbs of their recorded show weight. Once an exhibitor's entry has been reweighed from class, there will be no further weigh backs for that particular entry. Any issues regarding the scales or the weighing process must be brought to the show officials prior to check-in ending, after that time no issues regarding the weighing process will be addressed.
16. Fitting and painting will not be allowed in any of the swine barns. Fitting and painting must be done outside of the barns and not on any asphalt or concrete surfaces. No painting or fitting can be done in the holding areas. All paints and adhesives must be dry before entering the holding area and before there is potential of coming into contact with other pigs.

SHOWMANSHIP: 12 noon Friday, December. 11, 2026

Following Cattle Showmanship - Market Heifer and Steer Show, (Class winners will be eligible to compete in the Supreme Drive on Saturday at 5 p.m.), Bull Show (Breed or division winners will compete in final drive Saturday evening).

HEIFERS: Following the Market Beef Show and bull show, Charolais, Hereford, Red Angus, Shorthorn and American Breeds. Remaining heifers will continue showing Saturday at 8 a.m. All Breed Champions will be eligible to compete in the Supreme Drive on Saturday at 5 p.m.

Market Beef Show: Divisions this year will be prospect and progress. Cattle under 1000 lbs. will show as prospects and 1001 lbs. and over will show as progress. This will apply to market heifers as well. Market heifers will compete in market heifer classes only and will be eligible to compete for overall awards in their respective weight divisions.

All heifers must be born January 1, 2025 and after.

Any exhibitor 21 years of age or under is eligible to show.

Health- Valid health papers are required and will be checked upon arrival.

Entries are open to the world. Market steer, market heifer and heifer show. Market steers and market heifers will be shown by weight. Purebred heifers with registration certificates will be shown by breed by age. Commercial heifers without registration papers will be shown by weight.

The barn will open on Wednesday, December 9 beginning at 4:00 p.m. and on Thursday, December 10 beginning at 8:00 a.m.. Check in will be Thursday, December 10, 2026 from 2 p.m. – 5 p.m. Steer and market heifers will weigh in on the official scales, heifers entries will be checked at your stalls between the hours of 2-5 p.m. More details to come.

There is no limit to the number of entries per exhibitor.

Prize money in class will be awarded to the top three and the top three in each division will be awarded.

All entries will be submitted Nov. 1st - Dec. 1st through theshowportal.com. The entry fee is \$45.00 per head. A late fee of \$20.00 per head cash will be required after this date and will be collected at check-in. The committee reserves the right to refund money to entries if the number of entries exceeds. **THE LATE FEE WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED AND NO REFUNDS WILL BE GIVEN.**

Cattle do not have to be entered in the State Cattle Show to enter this show.

Showmanship: Showmanship will be broken up by age (depending on numbers) and will be 100% payback to the top 3 exhibitors.

Steer Show: All steers will be weighed. Steer classifications will be Prospect and Progress. A top 3 will be named from each division.

Market Heifer Show: Market heifers will compete in their own class within the respective weight divisions and will be eligible for the overall grand prizes in the prospect and progress division. Market heifers can also compete in the commercial heifer show but an additional entry fee will be assessed.

Heifer Show: Heifers will be shown according to breed and should have valid registration papers. The show will require there to be a minimum of 8 heifers pre entered to constitute a breed, otherwise they will be placed into the AOB category. A top three in each breed will be named and will be eligible to return for the supreme heifer drive. Commercial heifers will be shown by weight and are also eligible to compete in the market heifer show but an additional entry fee will be assessed.

Bull Show: All bulls must be born after January 1, 2025. Bulls will show by age. All bulls must be shown with a nose lead. All bulls must have neck rope when tied into the stalls in the barns. All bulls must be tied to tie out panels at night and must have a neck rope. All bulls must have a registration certificate. The registration certificate should be in the name of the junior exhibiting the bull. Multiple juniors can be listed on the registration papers as long as they are from the same family. The show will require a minimum of 8 bulls per breed pre-entered to constitute a breed; otherwise it will be placed into the appropriate AOB category. AOB categories will be divided into British, Continental, and American-Influence. EPD profiles will be available to the judge to use at his discretion during the show. EPD profiles will be printed the week prior to the show. The top three in each breed will be named and will be eligible to return for the supreme bull drive held on Saturday evening during the all species grand drive.

1. All does must be owned by the exhibitor (register does must be owned by the exhibitor prior to the show with ABGA) and Commercial Does must be tagged that matches registration for the show.
2. All entries will be submitted Nov. 1st - Nov. 30th through theshowportal.com.. Late entries will be cash only and an additional \$20 fee per entry will be accessed to the original entry fee.
3. Exhibitors can enter any amount of animals into the show but only make substitutions to show the animal if the exhibitor has more than one animal in the same class. All substitutions must be exhibited at the show.
4. Goats must have an official health certificate (health paper), according to State Department of Agriculture Health Regulations on pages 7-10. It is important that this requirement be met; without health papers, goats will not be unloaded. All Does must have a Scrapie tag. If traveling from out of state, ensure destination Georgia National Fairgrounds.
5. Exhibitors are eligible from anywhere and must be 21 years of age or under. Showmanship will be broken by birthdate into age appropriate divisions.
6. Registration papers are not required for Commercial Breeding Does.
7. All Does will be shown by weight.
8. **If 15 or more** % does or Fullblood are checked in at the show then there will be a division for these animals.
9. Goats must be housed in the barn from check-in to completion of showing. Housing in trailers is prohibited.
10. All goats must be dehorned or have horns tipped and rounded.
11. Shearing and length of hair is left to the discretion of the exhibitor.
12. Only show officials and exhibitors are allowed in the show ring.
13. A Champion, Reserve Champion, and 3rd Place will be selected in each Division. A Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion will be selected from the Division Champions and Reserve Champions. In addition, a third, fourth, and fifth place overall goat will be selected from Division Champions, Reserve Champions, and 3rd places.
14. The barns will be open beginning at 4:00 p.m. on Wednesday, December 9th and Thursday, December 10th beginning at 8:00 a.m.
15. Check in will be from 3:00 p.m.-5:00 p.m. on Thursday, December 10th and Friday, December 11th from 8:00 a.m.- 11 a.m..

1. All Ewes must be owned by the exhibitor (register ewes must be on by the exhibitor prior to the show with breed associations) and Commercial ewes must be tagged that matches registration for the show.
2. All entries will be submitted Nov. 1st - Nov. 30th through theshowportal.com.
3. Exhibitors can enter any amount of animals into the show but only make substitutions to show the animal if the exhibitor has more than one animal in the same class. All substitutions must be exhibited at the show.
4. Sheep must have an official health certificate (health paper), according to State Department of Agriculture Health Regulations on pages 7-10. It is important that this requirement be met; without health papers, ewes will not be unloaded. All ewes must have a Scrapie tag. If traveling from out of state, ensure destination Georgia National Fairgrounds.
5. Exhibitors are eligible from anywhere and must be 21 years of age or under. Showmanship will be broken by birthdate into age appropriate divisions.
6. Registration papers are not required for Commercial Breeding Ewes.
7. All Ewes will be shown by weight. Classification will be done at check in. If a sheep doesn't fit the classification that it is registered under then it will show in the classification determined by the show committee. All classifications will be final at check in.

1. All heifers must be in possession of the exhibitor on or before November 15, 2026. Entries must be made online **by November 15, 2026**. A copy of the online entry form signed by the parent, and the exhibitor must be mailed with a photograph of the animal **by November 22, 2026** for the entry to be complete. Mail to Carol Williams, 1141 Broughton Rd, Madison, GA 30650.
2. Entry fees are **\$30** per heifer.
3. Heifers must be tagged with an official state ear tag and photographed. Photographs must clearly show the animal from the side, and ear tags must be readable in the picture. Tattoos are required on solid color calves regardless of breed. Solid colored calves without a tattoo will not be allowed to show. Place tattoo in left ear in center with green ink, if possible. The tattoo number need not correspond to state ear tag number. If a heifer loses a tag, you must notify the Show Manager within 7 days.
4. Each exhibitor may enter a maximum of five (5) heifers. An exhibitor **can show** 5 heifers to the show.
5. Heifers must be checked in and stalled by 3 p.m. Friday, December 11th, 2026, at the Beef & Dairy Arena. Weigh-in is from **1:00 pm until 3:00 pm December 11**.
6. Heifers shall meet the following requirements to be eligible:
 - Heifers must be born between **March 1 and August 31, 2026**.
 - Commercial dairy heifers may be of mixed dairy breed or any dairy breed that are not registered. The animal cannot be registered or shown as a registered animal through December 31, 2026. Violation will result in disqualification.
 - Heifers weighing less than **150** pounds and more than **800** pounds at the time of weigh-in at the show will be disqualified and considered under or over conditioned for their age. These heifers will not be eligible for showmanship. There will be no reweighs once heifers leave the scale area.
 - All heifers must be dehorned. Heifers not dehorned will be disqualified. Any regrowth should be rasped and made presentable and should not exceed one inch in length.
7. Heifers will be sorted into classes by weight. There will be no reweighs once heifers leave the scale area.
8. Showmanship classes will be based on the exhibitors' grade in school. **There will be 3 showmanship classes: Novice (4-6 grade), Junior (7-9 grade) and Senior (10-12 grade).**
9. Do not bring straw into the cattle barn. Heifers must be bedded with shavings.
10. An exhibitor will not be permitted to enter the show ring with another student's calf unless the calf belongs to an exhibitor with two entries in the same class (or they are showing an animal in another species show).
11. Weight classes will be divided into Divisions. The first and second from each weight class will make up the Division drive. The judge will select a Division Champion, a Reserve Division Champion, and a 3rd Overall Division Champion from each Division to make up a final drive. Top Five (5) will be selected from the final drive.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS - Commercial Dairy Heifer

1. Age Requirements for the Commercial Dairy Heifer Show - An exhibitor must be in the 4th grade or older on September 1, 2026, and cannot have completed high school.
2. All exhibitors must maintain continuous full ownership, possession and provide primary care for their animal project from the time of entry until show day. **THE ANIMAL CANNOT BE SHOWN IN ANY SHOW OR PLACE IN ANY OTHER NAME OTHER THAN THE EXHIBITOR'S FROM TIME OF ENTRY TO DATE OF SHOW.**
3. Each exhibitor must show his or her own animal unless the exhibitor has more than one in the same class, is showing another species at the same time, or permission is given by the chairmen of the show. All substitute show persons must be 4-H or FFA members, entered in the show, and approved by the show chairmen. No one other than exhibitors or show officials are allowed in the ring during the show.
4. All exhibitors participating in showmanship must show his/her own animal in the showmanship classes.
 - a. Exhibitors' animals that are eliminated from the show due to any reason are not eligible to be shown in showmanship. If the exhibitor has another animal entered in that show that is eligible, the exhibitor is required to show the eligible animal in showmanship.
 - b. Exhibitors in showmanship will not be allowed to change their animal once the showmanship class starts. Animals cannot be changed between qualifying within a heat and the final drive.
5. All decisions made by the executive committee for each show regarding rules and regulations will be final. Once an animal is disqualified from the show, that animal will not be allowed back into the check-in area.
6. All animal projects will be shown at the owner's risk. Each exhibitor must assume liability in case of death or injury to their livestock. Replacing sick, injured, or dead animals after the entry deadline is not allowed.
7. Any animal exhibiting signs of an infectious or contagious disease/condition/sickness (confirmed by an on-site, designated veterinary individual) must be removed from the barn (and tie-out area) and will be removed from all competitive classes.
8. Loss of official ear tag must be reported to the Show Manager within 7 days. Commercial dairy heifers must have an official state ear tag to check in to the show.
9. Tattoos must be readable and conform with the tattoo listed on official entry forms and entry papers.
10. There will be no reweighs once the dairy heifers leave the scale area. All exhibitors questioning weights should voice concern at the time the animal weight is announced. When weights are declared, the show committee may reweigh animals that are questionable regarding minimum weight.
11. No alcoholic beverages are allowed on the fairgrounds during Junior Shows.
12. No camping or overnight sleeping is allowed in barns or tieouts during the show.
13. Direct criticism or interference with the judge or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. In furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.
14. **RULES COMPLIANCE** - Anyone failing to comply with any rules of the GJLF Livestock Show will forfeit any prize money and trophies and the right to show at future shows.

15. ANY OF THE FOLLOWING VIOLATIONS WILL AUTOMATICALLY RESULT IN DISQUALIFICATION:

- a. Animal has been found to contain evidence of drugs as described in these rules may be subject to the following penalties at the discretion of the show management including forfeiture of prize money, forfeiture of titles, trophies, and awards.
- b. Misrepresenting the age of the animal for the class in which it is shown.
- c. Swapping (exchanging) any animal after it is officially entered (according to entry deadline).
- d. Surgery of any kind performed to change the natural contour or appearance of the animal's body or hide other than surgical dehorning.
- e. Insertion of foreign material under the skin other than registered approved growth implants.
- f. The use of alcoholic beverages in the feed or administered as a drench.
- g. Minimizing the effect of unsoundness by feeding or injecting drugs, depressants, or applying packs or using any artificial contrivance or therapeutic treatment except normal exercise.
- h. Interfering with the judge, exhibitors, classifiers, breed committees, grievance committees, weigh committees and other show officials or other conduct detrimental to the show.
- i. Failure to properly care for animals while at the show grounds. (Proper care includes feeding, bedding, and handling deemed appropriate by show species committee and veterinarian, if needed.)
- j. Inhumane or abusive treatment of animals may result in disqualification at the discretion of the show management and/or judges.
- k. Failure to comply with Policy on Drug Use and Testing.

16. Protests: Any protests against eligibility, or adherence to the rules and regulations must be filed as a written and signed statement with the show chairman prior to the end of the show. Protests will be accepted from 4-H or FFA exhibitors, county agents or agricultural education teachers only.
